Dr. Margaret is an award-winning conservation education leader and expert in children and youth engagement, with over 25 years of strategic experience in climate advocacy, environmental education, and community empowerment. Her passion for nature conservation and inclusive governance began early in her career and has since shaped transformative programming across Kenya and beyond. Dr. Margaret currently serves as Deputy Chair and Regional vice Chair for Eastern and Southern Africa, IUCN Commission on Education and Communication (CEC) and is also the National Coordinator and CEO of the Wildlife Clubs of Kenya (WCK) a pioneering conservation organization and IUCN member for more than 25 years. WCK has inspired similar youth-led movements globally. Since 2008, she has scaled national conservation impact by leading WCK to engage millions of young people in more than 5000 schools and by expanding its Endowment Fund for the financial sustainability of the organisation. Her influence includes founding the Community Conservation Strategies (CCS), serving on multiple boards, and driving policy-responsive education models across Africa, In 2020, Dr. Margaret was honoured with the prestigious Brandwein Medal for her lifelong dedication to environmental education. Her innovations include the annual East African Teachers Programme, which continues to promote conservation leadership in the region. Through her roles, Dr. Margaret continues to champion youth-driven action, grassroots advocacy, and cross-sector partnerships for a more sustainable planet.
