### **Summary**

Craig is Chief Executive of <u>The Wildlife Trusts</u>, Honorary Professor of Sustainability and Innovation at <u>Alliance</u> <u>Manchester Business School</u>, and an Associate Fellow of <u>Homerton College</u>, <u>The University of Cambridge</u>. He is also a Commissioner on the <u>UK Government's Clean Power 2030 Advisory Commission</u>.

He has been described as "one of the country's top environmental campaigners", by *The Guardian* as "the very model of a modern eco-general" and in 2020 was included in The Sunday Times Green Power List of the UK's top 20 environmentalists. Craig was formerly CEO of Friends of the Earth UK where he led the organisation to numerous campaign victories including on bees, fracking and against airport expansion. He has extensive experience of governance of complex international environmental organisations, having served on the boards of both Friends of the Earth Europe and Friends of the Earth International, as well as many other boards.

He has a very strong reputation as an engaging and inspirational public speaker, media performer and thought leader. He has extensive experience of the broadcast media and has had many articles printed in national and international newspapers.
