I think many of you have got to know me over the past 20 years or so, but for those who don't, I'm someone who believes in people, especially the power and hope of youth. I'm something of a serial entrepreneur who has created and supported local and national teams, always trying to expand our ranks (and funding) and work myself out of a job. I also like to describe myself as a bit of a mongrel, I have benefited from living and working in multiple countries, communities and cultures, and this lived experience helps me to empathise with a diversity of perspectives.

If elected I will champion the **Enablers** for the Nature 2030 Plan, **why?** Because I believe they will be key to success of Nature 2030 and the 20-year vision. Typically, in strategy people focus on the 'content' areas but in my view, those are 'comparatively' easy parts. This work is significant as it embraces the essential role of education systems in inspiring future environmental leaders and building strong economies. It underpins the needs of both nature and people, ensuring that sustainability efforts are equitable and just and elevate ambition, accelerate action and scale up collaborative solutions, across multiple sectors of society.
